## Book Review by Leverne McBeth

*The Art of Racing in the Rain* by Garth Stein

Garth Stein created a novel for any dog lover. The whole novel is through the eyes of a dog. Enzo is a very smart dog who educated himself by watching television and listening very closely to the words of his master, Denny Swift.
