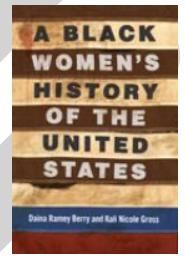
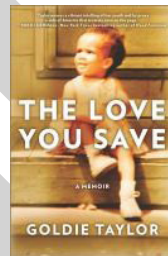
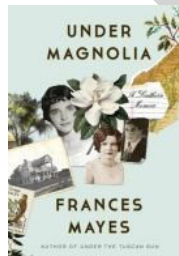

Glory Edim shared her personal journey with us in her new book titled *Gather Me: A Memoir of in Praise of Books that Saved Me*. Glory started the Well-Read Black Girl book club (wellreadblackgirl.org) in 2015. The book club has a following of half a million readers. *Gather Me* is a personal account that reflects on both the joyful and challenging times with her family while also addressing the struggles of being a Black woman in America with Nigerian ancestry. As I read this memoir, I learned how she used her love of literature to face racism, strived to keep her mother and brothers safe, and connected with her community. She shared a list of her favorite authors and included some of their literature in this memoir. I recommend this book to anyone who loves to share books and wants to peek into the life of a girl born to Nigerian immigrants living in America during the 1980s and 1990s.
