

Man's Search for Meaning by Viktor E. Frankl
Man's Search for Meaning is a powerful blend of memoir and psychological
reflection, written by psychiatrist and Holocaust survivor Viktor E. Frankl. In
the first part of the book, he recounts his time in Nazi concentration camps,
offering a deeply human and restrained account of suffering, loss, and
resilience. Rather than focus on horror alone, Frankl turns his experiences into
a profound meditation on the human capacity to endure, and the importance
of finding meaning even in the bleakest circumstances. The second part
introduces Frankl's psychological theory of logotherapy, which suggests that
our primary motivation in life is not pleasure or power, but purpose. His



insights are both practical and deeply moving - reminding us that while we may not always control what happens to us, we can choose how we respond. This book is both humbling and inspiring, offering a timeless message about strength, hope, and the meaning we create in our lives.
